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

All of our camps are booked and full for the size of our current centers.

For the first two weeks of June we held a two week camp at Emerson School in Denver for children 8 and under. We were so grateful to have Pearl come and lead this camp for us. It was so much fun seeing our youngest kids work so hard and enjoy meeting new kids who are in similar situations as themselves. We have our youngest student, Luke, attending this camp at the perfect age of two and a half. He was a lucky boy with all of the rest of our attendees being girls! We had a lot of fun together, especially when

After our June camp we said goodbye to Pearl and hello to Agnes, a new face to CFCE. Agnes has been a conductor for many years and works at the Peto Institute in Hungary throughout the year. She loves to come and work summer camps during her summer holiday. We were lucky to have her come to Colorado this year to run our 4 week camp in Loveland. This camp is full to the brim with 8 bright, hard working and encouraging children. We are enjoying the large group setting, which proves to be a great environment for the children to encourage one another, make new friends and a chance for parents to meet other parents who are going through similar situations. The children attend the camp for 5 hours a day, 5 days a week for 4 weeks. They grow so much in this time in their understanding of their bodies, the skills that they learn and the independence they realize they can achieve. These camps are so special for us as staff too because we see these young children push

and challenge themselves so hard to try and walk or achieve a task that we, the staff, can't help but go home and be inspired by them on a daily basis. It is so easy to take everything for granted and to give up on things when we are challenged, but when you see the determination on these kids faces during summer camp, you really need to go home and challenge yourself on those tasks we find too hard ourselves.

On July 8th, we started our final camp for 3 weeks back in Denver for children 6 and up. We hope this camp will also be a huge success and that we will be able to

We also would like to purchase a treadmill and/or special adapted bicycle for the centers. These items will be so beneficial to the kids but are extremely costly. 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Meet a Child: Taylor



Taylor was born prematurely with Cerebral Palsy due to complications during delivery. After 3 months in the hospital in intensive care, his lungs and digestive system were still weak, but he was finally ready to go home. He struggled for some time with aspirating his food, which made him quit breathing and the family almost lost him 3 times. He started physical therapy when he was 3 years old. It wasn't until October of 2011 that they found Conductive Education and CFCE. Taylor's mom, Lea, says that since starting sessions with CFCE, which has only been just short of 2 years now, they have seen Taylor doing things that he has never been able to do before. He holds his trunk

stronger and is able to sit, both of which allow him to breathe better. He helps to feed himself, rolls to move around the house, almost straightens his legs and can stand in his stander, uses his hands to prop himself up, is able to get words out and talk for a longer period of time and can lay on his stomach to stretch. He has also thoroughly enjoyed the skiing experience through CFCE and BOEC! In addition to the physical strength he is gaining, he mentally understands that the harder he works at something, and the more he practices, that he CAN do things he never knew he could do before. Lea says that the greatest thing about what CFCE does for Taylor is developing independence.

Taylor has his own business building bird houses, which gives him ambition and self confidence. This is just another example of Taylor turning into the kind, loving and independent person he now knows he can be.

Taylor turned 19 on July 9th. Happy Birthday Taylor from all of us here at CFCE!

Meet a Staff Member: Madeleine

Madeleine Van Oppen is a class assistant at CFCE. She has been with us since April of 2011. She shares that she loves the opportunity to work here at CFCE because of what we stand for and how hard we work to help the kids work on their independence. Madeleine thinks that our center gives the kids freedoms and opportunities that they don't see in other modalities. She loves helping us to identify what the kids are good at and what they need more work on. She also loves how we make the "work" fun for the kids, and for her, by incorporating music and crafts into the sessions.

Outside of her work with us here at CFCE, Madeleine works full-time at Rocky Mountain High School in Fort Collins, Colorado, as a special education paraprofessional. She supports kids with significant intellectual disabilities inside the classroom. Madeleine is also working on her Master's Degree in Special Education. She just finished her first year and has one more year and student teaching to go. After graduation, Madeleine will be seeking full-time employment as a special education teacher with a focus on transitioning from school to adulthood.



Working here at CFCE has shown Madeleine that there are many ways to incorporate different teaching approaches. We value the addition she makes to our team and hope to have her on board for years to come!

Our New Denver Location: Emerson School



Our classes in Denver have continued to show growth in the metro area over the past few months and we recently changed locations from Clayton Campus to Emerson School, 1420 Odgen Street, Denver, because we felt we needed more space. Although this is not necessarily a permanent location for CFCE-Denver, it is a great newly-converted building, situated just east of downtown Denver, that is shared by 9 other nonprofits. We are grateful to have found this location and look forward to Denver's continued growth to the point where we need to find yet another location that has an even bigger space for our Denver center.
