Summer Camps are so important at CFCE because they provide that

ideal learning environment for the children to work on and achieve new and challenging tasks that can be applied to everyday situations. The intensity of 5 hours a day and 5 days a week can really benefit the children especially in building up their strength. Proud to hail from Denver, CO, the KORY BRUNSON BAND combines a polished rock sound with a down home country feel to produce a genre of music they describe as "Hard Country", the title of their debut album. Originally formed by Brunson (hence the name), Craig Bennington soon came on board to join forces and contribute heavily to the writing and recording of the groups music.

The bands first single "Girls Night Out", a celebration of female independence and revelry, hit Media Base's Country

Music Radio Charts in June of 2010 landing at #76 giving the band their first Top 100 single. Their new album aptly titled "Hard Country" was released November 12th 2010. Their newest single release "We Know You're Out There" (long a trademark of the band) hit #63 on the National Country Music Radio Charts over July 4th weekend, 2011.

The band's music can also be heard on many radio stations across the country and around Colorado including nationally recognized KYGO. Brunson and Co. have toured across the heartland of America, including highlights at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Mile High stadium, Red Rocks, as well as an opening slot for national acts like Gretchen Wilson, Lee Brice, Chris Cagle, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and recently - Little Big Town. The band will be the opening act for Dirks Bentley on August 11th in Sterling, CO. A new album is already in the works, with a release date sometime in 2012.

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Meet a CFCE Child: Noah (written by Noah's mother, Stacey)



Noah Mitchell Warden was born December 23, 2008, weighing 9lbs and Ioz, by emergency c-section at 8:51am. Noah did not breathe or have a heartbeat for the first 13 minutes of his life. He was taken to Children's Hospital in order to have a procedure done known as brain cooling in attempts to minimize damage caused by perinatal asphyxia. Noah's brain cooled for 72 hours after which time the hospital ran an MRI and an EEG to determine the extent of the damage. Unfortunately, the results came back with devastating news. Noah had suffered "global damage" to his brain. As a result the prognosis was grim. They said Noah would most likely never walk, talk, eat or even breathe on his own.

Noah is now 3 1/2 years

old and although he is still unable to sit unassisted, talk, walk, crawl or even self-feed, he is making gains everyday. We made the decision to try Conductive Education for Noah in-home to offer him a chance at more individual independence and skills. Our therapist, Jennifer, has such tremendous faith and hope for Noah and is continually positive about Noah's potential, something that we and Noah need as a family on this special needs journey.

Too often children like Noah that are highly affected with Cerebral Palsy are dismissed as never having the chance to improve. We love that CE only thinks about all the things Noah will and can do someday - not what he will never accomplish.
